Homeless & Attending School, Guest Finds Support Capuchin ministry helps people to find ways to better their lives

“There’s a chain of events that have to happen to help people in my situation,” Brennan said. “From the donors who support St. Ben’s to the staff and volunteers who counsel us to guests who have to decide to make better choices.”

Brennan certainly epitomizes those who are working hard to turn their lives around. An intelligent young man, Brennan has benefitted from a number of Capuchin Community Services’ programs, mostly at St. Ben’s Community Meal. “The friars are helping me to get my life together,” Brennan said. “Br. Carl gives me my mail, I eat at St. Ben’s many evenings, they helped me with my ID and they’ve given me bus tickets so I could go to appointments. Now they are helping me earn my Adult High School Diploma.”

Carla Dupont, GED Coordinator said, “I met Brennan over a year ago. He had grown up in Detroit and left school after the 11th Grade. He came to Milwaukee and eventually realized he needed more education.”

Carla explained, “Br. Dave Schwab, the former ministry director and a former high school teacher started the program with me. St. Ben’s believes that whether guests graduate or not, getting more education always helps people to better their lives.” She paused and then added, “The grace of St. Ben’s Meal is that they look at the whole person.”

Brennan added, “A number of staff have helped me out. Kenny Howard has been a major support and he’s helping me to stay committed to making only good choices. Carla and others have given me good counsel and I can see where by the end of this year I’ll have my high school diploma.”

Carla smiled and said, “We were able to help Brennan apply to Milwaukee Area Technical College’s Adult High School program. We paid the fees, then helped with tuition and books. We only ask that the guests who qualify for school attend regularly and make progress. Brennan is one young man who I believe will complete the program before the year is out and receive his diploma in time for Christmas!”

When asked about his future goals Brennan said,

“I think I want to get a Culinary Arts degree. It’s a two year program and then I can use it to fund my travels.” Brennan hopes to someday travel to Africa, Canada and Japan among other countries.

“With the help of our donors guests like Brennan can shoot for the stars,” Br. Rob Roemer said. “It is always wonderful to be able to play even a small part in another person’s return to health and wholeness!”

Remembering Those We Lost

People come and go in our lives. In my seven years at Capuchin Community Services, I've seen a lot of people pass through both House of Peace and St. Ben's. Guests, staff, donors and volunteers. While some guests have been here for many years coming to use our services, others come in and out of our lives for a short time. They still leave a significant mark.

We gather this month to remember all the homeless who have died in the past year (27 to date of writing this). There are certain people who stand out. A film viewed recently called *30 Seconds Away* followed the lives of 5 homeless people in Milwaukee. One of them, Harold, was a regular each night at St. Ben's Community Meal, and was trying to overcome an addiction. Unfortunately, the addiction won.

Others stand out to me such as Cowboy, Michael S., Fred B., Ramon, and many others. They each had their own story. Some were quiet and went about their own business, never really opening the door to allow others to come to know them. They were important to the character of the ministry. They leave us with a sadness that we never got time to really know them.

Many who never knew any of those who died in the last year will come to light a candle and remember the names of each of those who passed alone on the streets. They deserve to be loved and remembered. Their lives mattered and they left an impact on us, whether they were outgoing or quiet. Let us never forget those who think they are forgotten and invisible. Our Saint Anthony campaign met its immediate goals, construction is well underway on 60 permanent apartments for homeless people, and we anticipate a grand opening this fall! Over 1,400 generous donors made this campaign a wonderful blessing.

Our next challenge is to fully support the expanded services at St. Anthony and other sites that will empower many more destitute people. Even though the Capuchins attract over 3,000 volunteers who assist in essential ministries, our direct cost for services is now \$2.6 Million.

Thankfully, many people who supported the campaign want to continue to help. Earlier this year, for example, the Falsetti family asked to tour the St. Anthony building where their father had served as a doctor, and were inspired to make a memorial gift in his honor. There are many other compassionate people whose gifts will be memorialized in the new building.
