Disabled Single Mom Finds Food & Friendship Mother of Three Celebrates Christmas & Easter Blessings

“I had to put my head down so my kids wouldn’t see my tears,” Schynitha said. Schynitha lives on Social Security Disability and is raising her three children just a half block away from the House of Peace.

“When I heard we could attend the Breakfast with Baby Jesus I was so excited. I knew that there was a lot I couldn’t give my children at Christmas but with the help of the House of Peace and their donors we did have a wonderful holiday.”

Fr. Perry McDonald, Pastoral Director said, “Schynitha’s family is one of over 2 dozen households that enjoyed Christmas because of the kindness of the parishioners at St. Francis Borgia Parish, Cedarburg. They prepare a breakfast feast, sing Carols and put on a Christmas pageant.”

Schynitha smiled and said, “They provided each family with gifts for the children so they’d have something to enjoy under the tree.”

Dominique McGhee, Emergency Food Pantry Manager said, “Our guests also receive a holiday food box so they can enjoy a Christmas meal at home.”

“I also depend on the House of Peace to help clothe my family,” Schynitha added. “I try to make an appointment to stop by the Capuchin Clothes Closet twice per month. With three children ages 14, 12 and 8 years old we can always use clothing.”

Recently the House of Peace received a donated computer and held a drawing. “I won,” Schynitha said. “When I got home my children were so excited that they could finally do their homework at home.”

The family doesn’t have internet or cable so the computer is more of a word processor. “But my kids can finally write their reports and submit them looking nice.”

Once per month Schynitha and her three children visit the Emergency Food Pantry. “The kids just love Dominique. So I bring them to say “hi” and I need them to help me carry the food home.”

One of the food items that Schynitha receives is meat from Usinger’s. Dominique explained, “Schynitha’s family is one of the hundreds of families that are benefiting from the one and one half tons of sausage and meat we are receiving after last year’s Capuchin Run Walk for the Hungry to German Fest.”

Schynitha said, “I hope everyone who went last year brings a friend. We need meat in our community and Usinger’s is delicious!” Fr. Perry added, “I join Schynitha in encouraging people to sign up to run or walk this year. The form is on the back and the registration form is online. Help the House of Peace raise funds and meat to feed the poor this year.”

It is important for me to talk with as many guests as possible, because it is through these conversations that I get the true back story. Now I am able to direct guests to the UWM-Community Nursing Center, Marquette University Volunteer Legal Clinic, or to the Social Worker so that they can get the assistance they need to live a more peace filled life.

It is because of the generosity of our donors, that we were able to provide

assistance to a young woman who struggled to enroll in college, and needed a computer in order to complete her assignments.

Your love for the “least of these,” helped the House of Peace to provide furniture for a family who had been homeless for almost a year. Your commitment to this ministry, has allowed us to help a mother to have a furnace repaired, during a harsh winter, so that her children would be warm.

So they call me Ma, and that’s ok. I along with staff and volunteers are able to nurture, listen, correct, and encourage those in need, expressing all of the wonderful attributes of Mothers.





AWARDS: Immediately following the Run/Walk, awards for 3 overall finishing times for Men and Women. In addition, the top three M/F runners will receive awards in each division.

2 MILE WALK: Non-competitive walk through Lakeshore State Park. Timing provided; not eligible for scoring or awards. \$20 Adult, \$10 Child [\$25 and \$15 after July 13] Child must be 12 or younger on race day.
